And now we are preparing for the next [Career Development Award](#) competition: the winner will be announced at our March 6, 2024 concert. As usual, this is a collaborative project with the CBC. It is funded by the WMCT Foundation with a prize of \$25,000 as well as a recital in our *Music in the Afternoon* series.

The CDA committee – Kathy Halliday, Tamar Adaskin Nelson, Adair Hope, Matthew Parsons (CBC) and myself – began its deliberations back in the summer with a review of the definition, selection process and timeline.
